

Your loyal support is so important to everyone at the BC SPCA – we truly value your generosity, care, and time.



## Programs and Services for the Community

At BC SPCA Kamloops, we've tirelessly provided shelter, medication, and nurturing until each of these animals found their forever homes.

Thanks to animal-lovers like you, our impact stretches far beyond the Community Animal Centre walls, encompassing everyday care for animals in need and swift responses to community emergencies.

Our array of programs and services, designed to bolster both animals and our community. We provide humane education, spay and neuter services, medical assistance, emergency supports and services, return lost animals to their families, conduct cruelty investigations, and engage with youth through camps, programs, education, and presentations.













### Impact

In 2023, with your support, we found refuge for 464 animals; cats, dogs, bunnies, rats, hamsters, guinea pigs, birds, goats, sheep and chickens who came into our care due to unfit living conditions.

In 2023, 65 animals were displaced and required emergency boarding and evacuation from their homes due to increasing emergencies, such as floods and wildfires in our community. And we were able to bring them into our Care Centre where we could provide them with medical assistance, safety, and love.

Your support is vital as we face increased challenges, including a significant increase in urgent cases where many vulnerable animals come into our care all at once.

Rescuing and caring for **864** injured, homeless, neglected, stray and abused animals, providing medical care, spay/neuter and other treatment as needed

## Murturing

Providing **65** animals with emergency pet boarding when their guardians were displaced

## Protecting

Protecting animals in over 455 cruelty investigations in the TNRD



Reaching over **1446** youth through virtual and in-person events, camps, workshops, and school presentations
